

David M. Hart is a senior fellow for climate and energy at the Council on Foreign Relations. His research focuses on policies that will accelerate clean energy and climate-tech innovation and diffusion worldwide. Hart's recent work for the Council's Climate Realism Initiative includes the "Global Energy Innovation Index" (November 2025). He also co-authored "Re-Energizing America" (Clean Tomorrow, 2025), a sequel to 2020's *Energizing America* (Columbia University Center for Global Energy Policy). His books include *Unlocking Energy Innovation* (MIT Press), *The Emergence of Entrepreneurship Policy* (Cambridge University Press), and *Forged Consensus: Science, Technology, and Economic Policy in the U.S., 1929-1953* (Princeton University Press). Hart was a professor and senior associate dean and is now professor emeritus at George Mason University's Schar School of Policy and Government. He has served as assistant director for innovation policy at the White House Office of Science and Technology Policy, director of the Center for Clean Energy Innovation at the Information Technology and Innovation Foundation, and assistant and associate professor at Harvard University's Kennedy School of Government. Hart is a Fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science and holds a Ph.D. in political science from MIT.
